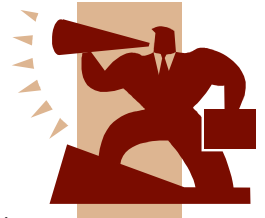
**Optimists visit Henry Co. Youth Center: June 28 and July 12**
